Indian Railways Signs MoU with

Switzerland's DETEC to enhance its

Technological Collaboration

Indian Railways has signed an MoU with the Federal Department of the Environment, Transport and Communications of the Swiss Confederation to enhance technical cooperation between the two nations.

This MoU will provide comprehensive framework for collaboration to the Indian Railways in various areas, including technology sharing, track maintenance, management and construction.

The original MoU, signed on August 31, 2017, was valid for five years.

Himachal Pradesh's Durgesh Aranya Zoological Park' set to become India's first Zoo with IGBC certification

The upcoming 'Durgesh Aranya Zoological Park' at Bankhandi in Kangra district would become India's first zoo to receive certification from the Indian Green Building Council (IGBC) for its sustainable and ecofriendly initiatives.

The project has officially been registered with the IGBC, focusing on both building and landscape certifications, which will validate the park's adherence to high environmental standards.

The certification underscores the state's priority on integrating sustainability into tourism and infrastructure development. Once completed, Durgesh Aranya will not only be a tourist attraction, but also a model for sustainable infrastructure, blending conservation with innovation.

Navy Chief Dinesh Tripathi launches 'Swavlamban 2024' exhibition

Navy Chief Admiral Dinesh Kumar Tripathi has inaugurated the 'Swavlamban 2024' exhibition at Bharat Mandapam.

The event aims to showcase innovations from the country's young entrepreneurs and strengthen collaborations between the Indian Navy and various industry stakeholders.

He expressed enthusiasm for the innovative solutions showcased by the nation's youth and noted the participation of around 115 stalls from diverse agencies, including the



Indian Air Force, Indian Army, Indian Coast Guard, and the Border Security Force (BSF).

Launched in 2022, the initiative aims to collaborate with Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and the Indian industry to address operational needs and bridge capability gaps within the Navy.

Karnataka celebrates Bali Padyami festival

Karnataka celebrates Bali Padyami festival on the fourth day of Deepavali.

It is believed that the Asura king Bali Chakravarty comes out of Pathala loka and visits Bhuloka as per the boon given by Lord Vishnu during Vamana Avatar.

After worshipping Ganga matha on the first day, Naraka Chaturdashi on the second and Lakshmi Pooja on the third day of Deepavali, the festival of Bali Padyami derives significance.

Cairn becomes India's 1st oil & Gas Company to join UNEP's OGMP 2.0.

Cairn Oil & Gas, part of Vedanta Group, has signed a memorandum of understanding with the United Nations Environment Programme's flagship methane reporting and mitigation initiative — Oil & Gas Methane Partnership

(OGMP) 2.0, making it the first oil and gas producer in India to commit to the effective reduction of methane emissions.

OGMP 2.0 established a comprehensive framework that includes best practices for emissions management and a robust reporting system. It emphasises accurate measurement, reporting, and verification (MRV) of methane emissions to drive reductions effectively.

MP Cabinet Increases Women's Reservation In State Government Jobs To 35%

Madhya Pradesh cabinet has approved a proposal to raise the reservation for women in state government jobs from 33% to 35%. The decision was made during a cabinet meeting led by Chief Minister Mohan Yadav.

The increased 35% women's quota will apply to all recruitments conducted by the state Public Service Commission and the Employees Selection Board.

Madhya Pradesh-Rajasthan joint panel formed for coordination on cheetah project

In the wake of incidents of cheetahs from Madhya Pradesh straying into neighbouring Rajasthan, a joint corridor management committee of both the states has been

formed to work for conservation of the felines.

The panel will also discuss development of suitable areas for future shifting of cheetahs from Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park (KNP), and Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary area and recommend measures for improvement including the pre-augmentation base, an official said in a statement.

Under the ambitious cheetah reintroduction project, eight Namibian cheetahs were released into enclosures at the KNP in Sheopur district on September 17, 2022.

Govt launches Rs 500 crore scheme to strengthen medical devices industry

Union Chemicals and Fertilisers Minister JP Nadda has launched a Rs 500 crore scheme to strengthen India's medical devices industry, focusing on critical areas such as manufacturing key components and accessories, skill development, support for clinical studies, development of common infrastructure, and industry promotion.

This initial outlay of Rs 500 crore will be for three years, up to financial year 2026-27.

The overall scheme consists of five components, including common facilities for

medical device clusters, capacity building and skill development, a marginal investment scheme for reducing import dependence, clinical studies support.

Under the scheme, Rs 110 crore has been allocated to strengthen infrastructure through the creation of common facilities such as research and development (R&D) labs, design and testing centres, and animal labs for around 20 medical device clusters in India. This will also include the enhancement of testing facilities.

Similarly, Rs 180 crore has been outlined for a marginal investment scheme to deepen the value chain by incentivising the production of key components and raw materials used in the manufacturing of medical devices, thereby reducing import dependence. This sub-scheme offers a one-time capital subsidy of 10-20 per cent, with a maximum cap of Rs 10 crore per project.

AMU case: SC overrules 1967 order denying minority status

The Supreme Court of India ruled that Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) overruled the 1967 verdict, noting that the university may be entitled to minority status under Article 30 of



the Constitution of India. However, the court has transferred the case to a regular bench.

Chief Justice of India, Justice D Y Chadrachud led 7-member constitutional bench of the Supreme Court (4 in favour and three against) overturned the previous 5-judge constitutional bench judgement in the Azeez Basha vs Union Of India 1967 case on the 'minority status' of the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU).

In the Azeez Basha vs. Union of India case, the Supreme Court declared that AMU was not a minority educational institution as it was established through an act of legislature. The court opined that an institution established by an act of legislature cannot claim to be a minority institution.

The Aligarh Muslim University was set up under the provisions of the Aligarh Muslim University Act 1920.

The Supreme Court has now held that a future regular bench of the Court will decide whether Aligarh Muslim University is a minority educational institution based on the majority judgement in the present case.

In the Malay Shukla Vs Aligarh Muslim University case 2006, the Allahabad High Court relied upon the Supreme Court judgement of the Azeez Basha case, held that

the Aligarh Muslim Muslim University was not a minority institution and it cannot reserve 50 per cent Post Graduate Medical seats for muslims.

Hindalco ranked world's most sustainable aluminium company

Hindalco Industries Limited, the metals flagship of the Aditya Birla Group, has been ranked the world's most sustainable aluminium company for the fifth consecutive year.

In the 2024 edition of the S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessment (CSA) rankings, Hindalco was the only aluminium company to secure the top position. It got a total score of 87 points (as of 30 October 2024), improving its tally by 9 points from 2023. It was 22 points ahead of its closest peer.

In a first, the tri-service exercise 'Antariksha Abhyas 2024', a three-day exercise aiming to secure India's national strategic objectives in space, begins in Delhi.

The exercise is expected to help secure national strategic objectives in space and integrate India's space capability into military operations.

The Space Exercise aims to provide enhanced understanding of space-based assets and services and to gain understanding of operational dependency on the space segment between stakeholders.

Ministry of Textiles approves 12 research projects worth INR 13 Crores under the National Technical Textiles Mission

The 10th Mission Steering Group under the chairmanship of Union Minister of Textiles has approved 12 research projects of value INR 13.3 Cr. under the National Technical Textiles Mission.

The research projects were approved across key strategic areas of geotextiles, sustainable and smart textiles, composites, etc.

The approved projects were proposed by eminent research bodies and institutions including IITs, NITs, CRRI, etc. The total number of approved research projects under the

Mission now stands at 168 with a total value of approx. INR 509 Cr.

World's first high-altitude para sports centre to come up in Leh

The world's first high-altitude para sports centre will be established in Leh, Ladakh, aiming to advance the skills and confidence of athletes ahead of the 2028 Paralympics.

A Memorandum and Understanding (MoU) to this effect was signed by the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC), Leh, and the Aditya Mehta Foundation (AMF).

Indian para-athletes have won 29 medals, including seven gold, in the 2024 Paralympics in Paris and it is a testament to the talent we have in our country.

Amaravati capital project gets major boost with Rs. 13,500 crore loan from World Bank and ADB

The dream of a world-class capital for Andhra Pradesh is advancing with a major funding boost. The World Bank and Asian Development Bank have jointly agreed to grant a loan of Rs. 13,500 crore rupees for Amaravati development project.

The two-day long negotiations between executives of World Bank, Asian Development Bank, Union Finance Ministry and the Andhra Pradesh Capital Region Development Authority in New Delhi concluded on a positive note with the World Bank and ADB giving final clearance to grant a loan of Rs. 13,500 crores for development of green field capital city, Amaravati.

Titled, "the Amaravati Inclusive and Sustainable Capital City Development Program," the program aims to build a safe and sustainable city with focus on inclusive socioeconomic growth and community development.

PM Modi inaugurated 1st Bodoland Mahotsav

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated the 1st Bodoland Mahotsav in New Delhi. The two-day Mahotsav is a mega event on language, literature, and culture to sustain peace and build a Vibrant Bodo Society.

The Mahotsav aims to integrate the indigenous Bodo people residing not only in Bodoland but also in other parts of Assam, West Bengal, Nepal, and other international border areas of the North East.

The theme for the Mahotsav is 'Peace and Harmony for Prosperous Bharat' with a focus on the rich culture, language and education of the Bodo community along with other communities from the Bodoland Territorial Region.

India, Japan sign agreement for UNICORN masts for Indian naval warships

A Memorandum of Implementation (MoI) was signed at the Embassy of India, Tokyo between Govt of India and Govt of Japan, for the co-development of UNICORN mast for fitment onboard Ships of the Indian Navy.

The Unified Complex Radio Antenna (UNICORN) is a mast with Integrated Communication systems that will help improve the stealth characteristics of Naval Platforms.

The Indian Navy is pursuing the induction of these advanced systems which will be codeveloped by Bharat Electronics Limited in India with Japanese collaboration.

Reliance, Disney complete merger; form Rs 70,352 crore joint venture

Reliance Industries has completed the merger of its media assets with the India business of



global media house Walt Disney to form a new joint venture worth Rs 70,352 crore.

The JV, in which Reliance Industries has invested Rs 11,500 crore (USD 1.4 billion) for its growth, will be headed by Nita Ambani as its Chairperson.

Reliance Industries holds a 16.34 percent stake in the JV, while its step-down unit Viacom18 holds 46.82 percent and Disney the rest 36.84 percent.

Sarai Kale Khan ISBT Chowk in Delhi renamed after Birsa Munda

Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Manohar Lal Khattar announced, the chowk outside the Inter-State Bus Terminal (ISBT) bus stand in Delhi's Sarai Kale Khan will be renamed after Bhagwan Birsa Munda.

The decision was announced on the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of the freedom fighter and tribal leader Bhagwan Birsa Munda.

This decision was taken to honour the freedom fighter so that people visiting the area could know about him and get inspired by his life.

24 coastal villages in Odisha recognised by UNESCO as 'Tsunami Ready'

24 coastal villages in Odisha were recognised by the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission of UNESCO as 'Tsunami Ready'.

The recognition was given during the 2nd Global Tsunami Symposium held in Indonesia.

These villages are located in Balasore, Bhadrak, Kendrapada, Jagatsinghpur, Puri and Ganjam districts.

US announces return of over 1,400 looted artefacts to India

The United States announced the return of over 1,400 looted artefacts valued at 10 million dollars to India.

The items, part of an ongoing initiative to restore stolen art to South and Southeast Asia, include pieces recently displayed at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art. Among the returned treasures is a sandstone sculpture of a celestial dancer, illicitly transported from central India to London before being sold to a Met patron and subsequently donated to the museum.

Manhattan District Attorney's Office revealed the recovery was the result of 'several ongoing investigations' targeting looting



networks, including those run by convicted art traffickers Nancy Wiener and Subhash Kapoor.

Kapoor, a former antiquities dealer, was sentenced to 10 years in prison for managing a multimillion-dollar looting operation through his New York gallery. After his arrest in Germany in 2011, Kapoor was extradited to India, where he awaits further legal proceedings and extradition to the US.

CCI slaps penalty of Rs 213 crore on Meta for abusing dominant position

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has slapped a penalty of Rs 213.14 crore on Meta, the US-based firm which owns WhatsApp, for alleged abuse of its dominant position in the implementation of the messaging app's 2021 privacy policy.

In an order, the antitrust regulator said that user data was collected and shared with other Meta companies in contravention of the competition law. It asked Meta and WhatsApp to implement certain behavioural remedies within a defined timeline, on top of issuing cease-and-desist directions for these entities.

The Commission has concluded that the 2021 policy update by WhatsApp on a 'take-it-or-leave-it' basis constitutes an imposition of

unfair condition under the Act, as it compels all users to accept expanded data collection terms and sharing of data within Meta Group without any opt-out," the regulator said in a statement issued separately.

<u>Three Chinese astronauts enter space station</u> <u>after successful launch</u>

Three Chinese astronauts, including a woman, made a smooth entry into the orbiting space station after the successful launch of their spaceship to man the station for the next six months.

The three astronauts of China's Shenzhou-19 spaceflight mission have entered the Tiangong space station and met with another astronaut trio starting a new round of in-orbit crew handover.

Earlier, the spaceship Shenzhou-19 carrying the three astronauts successfully docked with the space station combination. The spaceship made a fast, automated rendezvous and docking with the front port of the space station's core module Tianhe at 11 after which the three astronauts entered it.

18-Year-Old Nepal's Nima Rinji Sherpa Conquered World's 14 Highest Peaks

At just 18 years old, Nepal's Nima Rinji Sherpa has achieved a milestone few have accomplished, becoming the youngest climber to reach all 14 of the world's tallest mountains, known as the "eight-thousanders."

Mr Rinji's journey culminated with the summit of Shishapangma, Nepal's 8,027-metre peak, alongside climbing partner Pasang Nurbu Sherpa.

352nd Governing Body meeting of ILO is underway in Geneva

The 352nd Governing Body meeting of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) was held in Geneva.

During the meeting Labour and Employment Secretary Sumita Dawra highlighted India's commitment to improving living standards reflected in significant initiatives covering all dimensions of poverty that have led to 248 million individuals escaping multidimensional poverty in the last nine years as measured by the multidimensional poverty index.

ADB launches action plan to boost disaster resilience in Asia and Pacific

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has announced a new action plan to enhance its



disaster resilience efforts in Asia and the Pacific region.

The Disaster Risk Management Action Plan 2024-2030 outlines ADB's commitment to supporting its developing members in mitigating the impacts of disasters and climate change.

The action plan promises to guide the integration of disaster risk management components into ADB's operations, project design, and funding decisions.

In August, the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction warned that disasters in the Asia-Pacific region were projected to increase by 40 per cent by 2030.

Henley Passport Index 2024: India at 83rd; topped by Singapore

Singapore has been named the world's most powerful passport again, offering its citizens visa-free access to 195 countries, according to the latest Henley Passport Index released in October 2024.

France, Germany, Italy, Japan, and Spain shared the second place, granting their citizens visa-free access to 192 countries, as per the latest rankings.

The United States ranked 8th, giving its citizens visa-free entry to 186 countries.

Meanwhile, India ranked 83rd, providing its citizens with visa-free access to 58 countries.

EAM Jaishankar inaugurates India's new consulate in Brisbane

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has inaugurated the new Consulate General of India in Brisbane, underlining that this will contribute to strengthening India's ties with the Queensland state, promoting trade and serving the diaspora.

Queensland is home to almost 100,000 out of the nearly one million people of Indian-origin living in Australia, and India is the state's second-largest export market. Besides Brisbane, India has consulates in Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

Australia proposes ban on social media for children under 16

The Australian government will legislate for a ban on social media for children under 16.

Australia is trialing an age-verification system to assist in blocking children from accessing social media platforms, as part of a range of



measures that include some of the toughest controls imposed by any country to date.

A number of countries have already vowed to curb social media use by children through legislation, though Australia's policy is one of the most stringent.

No jurisdiction so far has tried using age verification methods like biometrics or government identification to enforce a social media age cut-off, two of the methods being trialed.

IIT Delhi No. 1 Indian Institute in QS World University Rankings: Asia 2025

The Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IIT Delhi) has been ranked as the top Indian educational institution in the latest QS World University Rankings Asia 2025.

IIT-Delhi has been ranked 44th best educational institution, while China's Peking University retained the top spot amongst the list of educational institutions in Asia as per the QS World University Rankings: Asia (2025).

Out of the 984 educational institutions included in the ranking, the highest, 162 were from India. IIT Delhi was the highest-ranked Indian institution, with a rank of 44, up from 46 last year. IIT-Delhi was also the highest-

ranked educational institution in the South Asian Region.

India ranked 6th in WIPO Global Patent Filings in 2023

India has, for the first time, has been ranked 6th in the world for Global Patent Filings in 2023.

According to the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) annual World Intellectual Property Indicators Report 2024, global patent filing increased by 15.7 % in 2023, primarily due to a strong increase in patent filing in India.

In 2023, the maximum patent filing was in China (1.64 million), followed by the United States of America (518,364), Japan (414,413),

South Korea (287,954), Germany (133,053) and India (64,480).

According to the WIPO report, More than 35 lakh patents were filed in 2023 across the world. The number of patents filed in India in 2023 was 64,480.

Blue loans are financing instruments that raise and earmark funds for investments such as water and wastewater management, reduction of marine plastic pollution, restoration of marine ecosystems, sustainable shipping, eco-friendly tourism, and offshore renewable energy.

The new "Special Care Gold" policy provides tailored health coverage for individuals with disabilities.

The policy is designed to meet the specific needs of people with 40% or more disability, including physical, sensory, or cognitive impairments.

World Bank ups India's growth forecast for FY25 to 7% due to rising private consumption

The World Bank upped India's economic growth forecast for the current fiscal year, ending in March 2025, to 7% year-on-year, up from April's estimate of 6.6%, helped by a rebound in agricultural output and increased private consumption.

This is aimed at empowering visually impaired individuals in India. This will allow the blind community to access health insurance information independently.

Japan set to test world's first wooden satellite

Scientists in Japan are set to test the world's first wooden satellite "LignoSat". The LignoSat was developed by a team from Kyoto University and homebuilder Sumitomo Forestry.

It will be launched next week atop a SpaceX rocket, bound for the International Space Station.

LignoSat – named after the Latin word for wood – will be released from the space station in the coming weeks. It will orbit for six months, testing how well the material can withstand the extreme environment.

ISRO set to launch EU's Proba 3 Sun observation mission in December 2024

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to launch the European Union's

Proba 3 Sun Observation Mission in December.

The two satellites for the Proba-3 mission, aimed at studying the Sun, arrived at Sriharikota to be integrated with ISRO's Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV).

The Proba-3 satellite, which arrived in Sriharikota this morning is designed to observe the Sun's faint corona. This mission marks India's third launch for the European Union, following support for the Proba-1 and Proba-2 satellites, but stands out due to its focus on solar observation.


